

Henry Ford spent his childhood on his dad's farm in Springwells township, south west of Detroit, MI. The first experimental Ford tractor was built in 1907. The "Automobile Plow" was the first tractor, and came with an engine and copper water jackets, and its rear wheels were taken from a binder. The first mass-produced tractor was called the Fordson. During 1916-1917, the tractor was built for export, and was introduced to American farmers in 1918. Fordson was the first lightweight mass-produced tractor on the market. During the 1920's, 75 percent of all tractors built in the United States were Fordson. In 1928, Fordson tractor production was halted in the US. only to be resurrected in 1939. as the Ford Model 9N. About that time, Ford started working with the Ferguson-Sherman company. As with many other tractor companies, the war changed the market of things. In 1955, the Ford Motor company introduced a new line of tractors with five new models in the 600 and 800 series. The last Ford tractor that Ford made was in 1991, when the company was sold out to Fiat. Today the Ford tractors are called New Holland. Throughout history, the Ford Motor company has made great farm tractors.

Back in May, 2021, I was lucky to sit down with Bob and Joyce Linton, to write a short story of their growing up and their tractors.

I got to hear about two different tractors: a 1949 Farmall H and a Ford 8N. Bob grew up with the Farmall, but Joyce's family farmed with Fords. Bob and Joyce grew up next to each other, and Bob still lives next to the family homesteads.

When they started to talk about the Ford tractor, that is when I heard the love story. They both knew that they always wanted to find a Ford, and one day Bob found that special one. Bob found the Ford 8N for sale along the road, but he did not buy it that day. He went home and told Joyce about it first, then went back and bought it the next day.

You see, Bob and Joyce were married in 1951, and the Ford 8N is a 1951. After 7 years, and a few times moving it around with the Farmall H, they started to restore it. The Ford 8N needed a new engine, paint job, and I am sure a few other parts. Today, they have a buddy seat that Joyce rode on during the many times they drove it across the Mighty Mac, and in a few tractor drives with the Old Iron Antique Tractor Club. Joyce has since passed away, but Bob continues to enjoy their Ford 8N and the many memories it contains. -Mary Baker

Bolens was founded in 1850. In 1919, they produced the first power-driven garden tractor. Immediately following World War II, Bolens was acquired by FMC Corporation, and continued production of outdoor yard equipment. In 1947, Bolens introduced the first compact tractor. The first Bolens Husky tractor made its appearance in 1961, and set a new standard for all compact tractors. Bolens, in 1963, introduced the Estate Keeper—a unique and years-ahead concept in compact tractors. Each product bearing the Bolens trademark is backed by this 116-year heritage (documented in 1966,) and by the extensive research and development facilities of FMC Corporation, and stands for proven dependability, advanced design, and the highest standard of quality.

## Interview with Wyatt Sackett

Wyatt Sackett, 23, lives in McBride and has been collecting garden tractors since he was 18, when he bought his first garden tractor-- a Simplicity 2010. Since then, he estimates that he has bought and sold between 60 and 70 garden tractors. His estimated present collection numbers between 25 to 30. His favorite models are Cub Cadets, especially his Cub Cadet 104 and Original Cub Cadet (Diesel). The oldest in his collection is a 1947 Bolens Ride Master (below) and his 1947 Big Case SC. Wyatt's hobby is collecting toy tractors and Cub Cadet garden tractors and apparel. He has traveled a bit to add to his collection, including North Carolina, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. ## Baker, Bates and Edmonds, and Briggs and Stratton

Baker Manufacturing Company, Evansville, WI A.S. Baker Co. was founded in 1872 as a machine shop and steam engine builder. By 1874, the steam engine was discontinued. With windmills and pumps becoming the principal products, the famous "Monitor" trademark was adopted in 1876. Monitor engines were first built about 1905. Years following an extensive line was offered, ranging in size from 1 ¼ Monitor pump engine to 15 hp horizontal style. Monitor Heavy Pattern engines in 10 & 15 hp came in 1912. Shortly after, 8, 11, & 15 hp series appeared for a few years. In 1918 the Monitor line included a series of horizontal engines in 3, 5, & 8 hp. The Little Baker vertical engine of 1905 was built in 2 & 3 hp sizes, and then came a series of vertical engines in 2, 4, & 7 hp. The ball-shaped water hopper was a distinctive feature. The engine production ended in 1944.

Bates and Edmonds Motor Co. Lansing, MI Beginning about 1900, this company introduced a line of vertical and horizontal engines. By 1908, the company had already built and sold 10,000 engines. At this time, the line included sizes 1 ½ to 25 hp, named Bull Dog, Bull Pup, and Bates & Edmonds. The company also produced engines under other names. The Bates & Edmonds pumper was available in a 1 ½ hp having a capacity of 900 GPH (gallons per hour) and the 4 hp was capable of 2,000 GPH.

## Briggs and Stratton Milwaukee, WI

The Briggs and Stratton Company was formed in 1908, bearing the owners names. The company concentrated on various automotive components and other products until 1919, when the famous Motor Wheel was acquired. The Model PB engine in 1923, used the Motor Wheel design, and prompted development of Model F in 1925. Model FH was the most popular seller from 1926 to 1930. In 1931, Model Y came out and 1936 Model WM came on the market – this style was specially designed for washing machines. After WW II, production of Briggs & Stratton engine came to over half a million units per year. An aluminum alloy engine was introduced in 1953, followed by many other innovations in recent years. Briggs & Stratton produced their 100 millionth engine in 1976.

## Hit-And-Miss and Yhrottle Governed Engines

What were engines used for? In the first part of the 20th century most farms in North America did not have electrical power or farm tractors. Heavy power was provided by horses and mules. Thousands upon thousands of small gasoline- and kerosene-fueled engines were made available to provide power for operating various farm equipment, machinery, and household items. Some of the many usages were as follows:

pumping water - sawing wood - grinding feed - shelling corn - washing clothes - separating cream - running grindstones - churning butter - generating electric
operating line shafts, which in turn could run multiple machines at the same time.

-The McBride Fire Department will be holding a fundraising dinner on Friday, from 4 pm to 6 pm. The public is welcome to enjoy!



Any tractors or engines that are running shall not be left unattended. There shall be no more than two (2) persons on one tractor that is moving at one time. No fender's mean no riders.

All belted equipment must have a safety rope or tape around it when in operation.

Anyone driving a tractor, or any powered equipment must be on the equipment in a position as to be in full control of the vehicle.

Mower decks must be removed, or blade belts detached on all displays.

Parents are fully responsible for their children.

Speed Limit shall not exceed 5 miles per hour on grounds for all vehicles.

No alcohol allowed on Show Grounds.

No person intoxicated, or under the influence of drugs or alcohol, shall be allowed to operate any equipment, or be close to any equipment in operation.

Drivers must be at least 16, have valid driver's license, and proof of insurance for golf carts, UTVs and similar types of vehicles to enter our grounds.

Bicycles, mopeds, go-carts, unauthorized people movers, unauthorized ATVs, UTVs, RTVs, and side by sides are not allowed on grounds or in

the campground.

- **1.** Minimum age limit of thirteen (13) years for operating a tractor, unless the child is accompanied by an adult or parent.
- 2. People movers require a seat for each passenger.
- **3.** All vehicles operating after dark must have and use proper lighting.
- 4. No glass containers allowed in display area.
