# Featured Tractors

## Case & David Brown

Founded in 1842 by Jerome Increase Case in Racine, Wisconsin, the J.I. Case Company revolutionized agriculture, evolving from a leading steam engine and threshing machine manufacturer in the late 19th century into a major tractor producer. In 1892, Case was the first company to build a diesel-powered tractor. Case shifted to gasoline tractors in the early 1900s. In 1967, Tenneco purchased J.I. Case and continued to market the products under the Case name. In 1972, Case acquired David Brown and merged with International Harvester in 1985 to form Case IH. David Brown tractors, originating from a UK gear-manufacturing firm in 1936, became a major agricultural force known for innovation, including the first three-point linkage (1937), Cropmaster series (1947), and Selectamatic hydraulics (1965). Founded by David Brown, the company produced iconic tractors in Meltham, Yorkshire, before being acquired by Tenneco (Case) in 1972, with production ending in 1988.



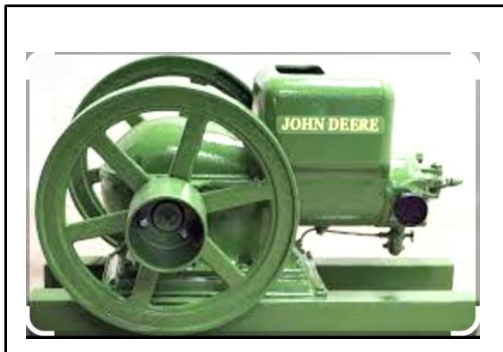
# Featured Garden Tractors

## Case, Colt, Ingersoll

Case garden tractors, originating from the 1964 acquisition of Colt Garden Tractors, became known for their robust, hydraulic-drive systems (labeled "Hi-Drive") and, after 1965, Kohler engines. In 1983, Jack Ingersoll purchased the division, rebranding them as Ingersoll tractors. Known for high-power hydraulics (8.5–12 GPM) and heavy-duty, long-lasting construction, they were produced in Winneconne, Wisconsin, until after 2015. Colt garden tractors, produced from 1962–1966 by brothers Wally and Warren Johnson in Wisconsin, were pioneers in using hydraulic drive systems for small tractors. Purchased by J.I. Case in 1964, the brand was phased out by 1966 in favor of Case-branded, similar-looking, heavy-duty machines. In 1996, the Colt brand was dropped, and by 1967, no more Colt-branded tractors were made, with production fully absorbed into the Case lineup.



## Featured Hit & Miss Engine John Deere



In early 1900's, John Deere had a variety of stationary gas engines. They were manufactured by Root & Vandervoort Engineering Co. of East Moline, Illinois, and the New Way Motor company of Lansing, Michigan. John Deere dealers offered these engines until Deere & Company purchased the Waterloo Gasoline Engine Co. in March 1918. Engines were produced in 2, 3, 5, 7, 9 and 14 hp sizes. The design made it a reliable engine, but by the early 1920's that design was outdated. New "enclosed" stationary engine designs replaced the Waterloo Boy line. The new design utilized an enclosed crankcase that allowed the engine to be self-oiled. The enclosed design was a major improvement. However, the old grease was pushed out onto the flywheels and was distributed over everything. And the sight-feed oiler that lubricated the piston had to be adjusted to ensure the right oil level (one drop every 10 seconds). When the engine was cold the oil wouldn't drip enough, and when the engine was hot, oil ran into the cylinders. If the operator forgot to turn off the oiler after running the engine, all the oil dripped out of the cylinder, into the crankcase and onto the ground. If the crankcase was too full, oil worked out through the flywheel bushings. A filler near the governor box allowed 1 1/8 inch of oil in the crankcase. This was hard to fill, so a tin funnel was placed in the engine hopper during shipping. As in later John Deere tractor designs, simplicity was a top priority in gas engine design: Fewer mechanisms meant fewer problems. Engineers proposed designs for 1 1/2, 3, 6, and 10 hp sizes, but focused on the 1 1/2 and 3 hp sizes.

# Hit-And-Miss and Throttle Governed Engines

What were engines used for?

In the first part of the 20th century most farms in North America did not have electrical power or farm tractors. Heavy power was provided by horses and mules. Thousands upon thousands of small gasoline- and kerosene-fueled engines were made available to provide power for operating various farm equipment, machinery, and household items.

Some of the many usages were as follows:

- pumping water
- sawing wood
- grinding feed
- shelling corn
- washing clothes
- separating cream
- running grindstones
- churning butter
- generating electric
- operating line shafts, which in turn could run multiple machines at the same time.



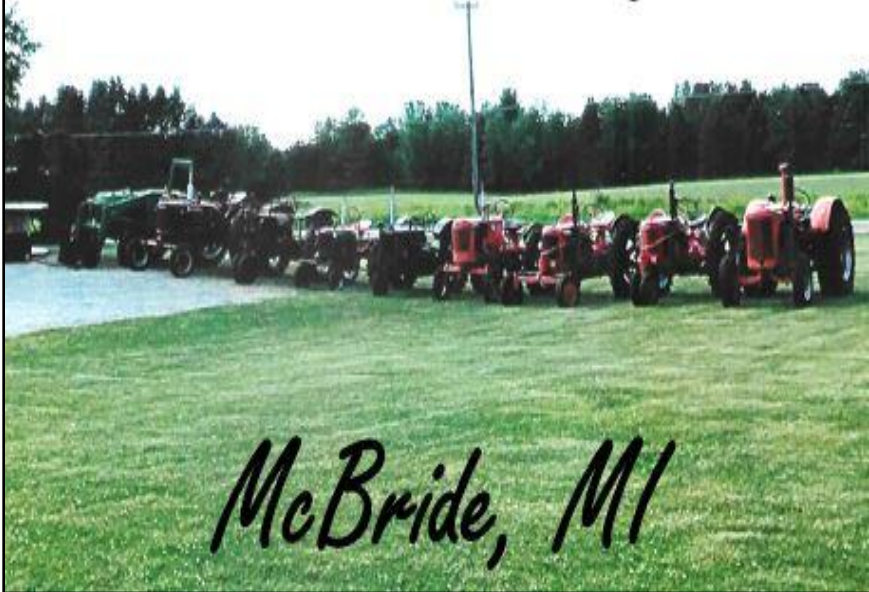

# Safety

- Any tractors or engines that are running shall not be left unattended.
- There shall be no more than two (2) persons on one tractor that is moving at one time. No fender's mean no riders.
- All belted equipment must have a safety rope or tape around it when in operation.
- Anyone driving a tractor or any powered equipment must be on the equipment in a position as to be in full control of the vehicle.
- Mower decks must be removed, or blade belts detached on all displays.
- Parents are fully responsible for their children.
- Speed Limit shall not exceed 5 miles per hour on grounds for all vehicles.
- No alcohol allowed on Show Grounds.
- No person intoxicated, or under the influence of drugs or alcohol, shall be allowed to operate any equipment, or be close to any equipment in operation.
- Drivers must be at least 16, have valid driver's license, and proof of insurance for golf carts, UTVs and similar types of vehicles to enter our grounds.
- Bicycles, mopeds, go-carts, unauthorized people movers, unauthorized ATVs, UTVs, RTVs, and side by sides are not allowed on grounds or in the campground.
  1. Minimum age limit of thirteen (13) years for operating a tractor, unless the child is accompanied by an adult or parent.
  2. People movers require a seat for each passenger.
  3. All vehicles operating after dark must have and use proper lighting.
  4. No glass containers allowed in display area.

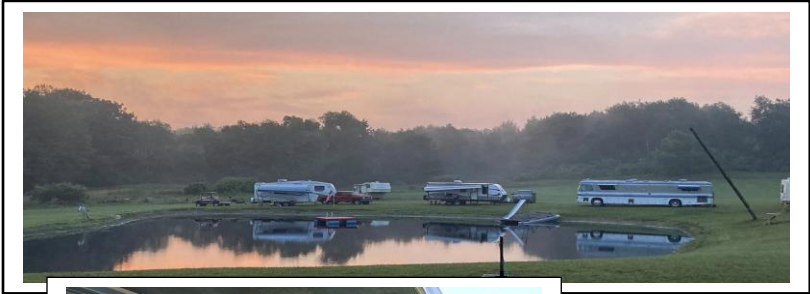


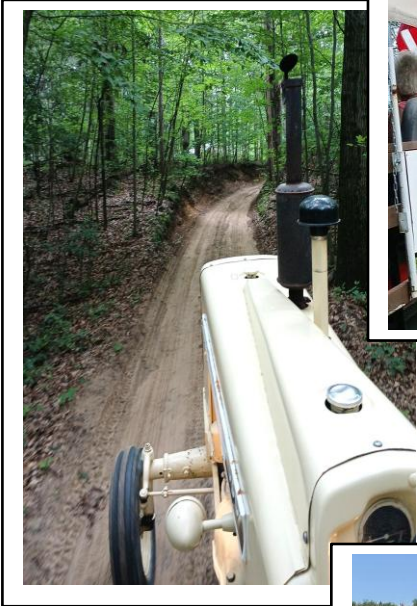
# Family Fun and Road Trips

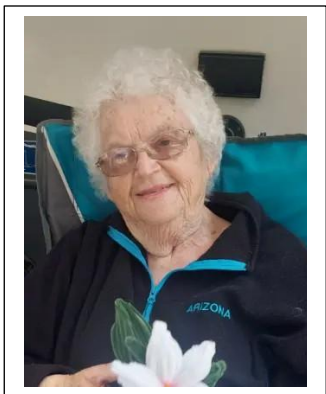

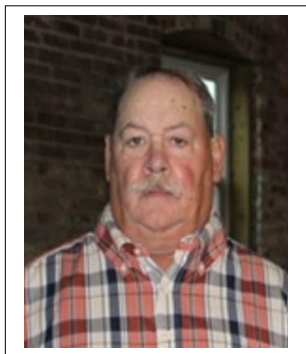
## In Memory

### Caroline Fitzpatrick



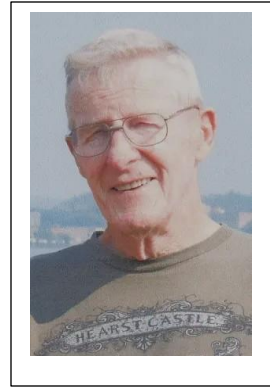

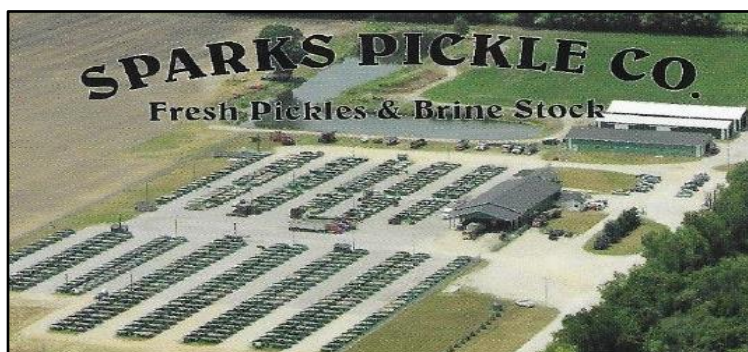
